MOTION FOR CLARIFICATION OF THE RECORD

DEFENDANT JEFFERY LAMAR WILLIAMS has been indicted along with DEFENDANT KAHLIEFF ADAMS, for Conspiracy to Violate the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act and Participation in Criminal Street Gang Activity, among other charges. To date, DEFENDANT WILLIAMS has filed multiple motions demanding a speedy trial, opposing a continuance of any kind, and alleging prosecutorial misconduct for one reason or another. The process of selecting the jurors to serve in this case is ongoing and juror hardships are being addressed by the Court.

1. DEFENDANT WILLIAMS' ACTIONS HAVE CAUSED A DELAY IN THE TRIAL

On Wednesday, January 18, 2023, ***after the call-to-order of the Court,*** Defendant Adams, who is currently serving a life-without-parole sentence for murder, conducted a hand-to-hand drug transaction with Defendant Jeffery Lamar Williams, in open court. Court surveillance video provided to the District Attorney by the Fulton County Sheriff captured Defendant Adams and Defendant

Williams as the two exchanged the narcotic. The District Attorney and the undersigned Deputy District Attorney observed the following chain of events depicted on the Fulton County Superior Courthouse Courtroom 1-C surveillance video provided to the District Attorney by the Sheriff.

On January 18, 2023, DEFENDANT KAHLIEFF ADAMS and DEFENDANT JEFFERY LAMAR WILLIAMS AKA YOUNG THUG conducted a hand-to-hand drug transaction inside Courtroom 1C of the Fulton County Superior Courthouse. DEFENDANT KAHLIEFF ADAMS stood up from his chair inside Courtroom 1C and walked unattended to where DEFENDANT JEFFERY LAMAR WILLIAMS AKA YOUNG THUG was seated at counsel table next to his attorney. DEFENDANT ADAMS approached DEFENDANT WILLIAMS and extended a closed right hand toward DEFENDANT WILLIAMS. DEFENDANT WILLIAMS extended his open right hand toward DEFENDANT ADAMS' closed right hand and accepted an item of contraband, to wit: PERCOCET, from inside DEFENDANT ADAMS' hand. DEFENDANT WILLIAMS then closed his right hand around the contraband and placed his closed right hand underneath the table where he sat next to his attorney, to conceal his receipt of the illegal contraband, to wit: PERCOCET.

Sheriff's Office personnel immediately approached DEFENDANT WILLIAMS and demanded that DEFENDANT WILLIAMS relinquish the contraband DEFENDANT WILLIAMS placed in his hand before placing his hand under the table. DEFENDANT WILLIAMS withdrew his right

hand from underneath the table and relinquished to Sheriff's Office personnel the contraband, to wit: PERCOCET, that he had attempted to conceal.

2. THE HAND-TO-HAND DRUG EXCHANGE BETWEEN DEFENDANT ADAMS AND DEFENDANT WILLIAMS LED TO THE DISCOVERY OF EVEN MORE CONTRABAND INSIDE THE COURTROOM

Following the hand-to-hand drug exchange between DEFENDANT WILLIAMS AND DEFENDANT ADAMS, Sheriff's Office personnel searched DEFENDANT ADAMS, who resisted being searched. During the search of DEFENDANT ADAMS, the Sheriff recovered from DEFENDANT ADAMS Percocet, marijuana, tobacco, and other contraband, wrapped in plastic and food seasonings to mask the odor of the marijuana. DEFENDANT ADAMS was then taken to Grady Hospital after he appeared to ingest other items of contraband that he held on his person, in an effort to conceal the extent of his crimes within the courtroom.

3. FOR ACCURACY, THE RECORD SHOULD REFLECT THAT DEFENDANT WILLIAMS' (along with DEFENDANT ADAMS') ACTIONS CAUSED A DELAY IN THE TRIAL

As a result of Defendant Williams' and Defendant Adams' possession and distribution, respectively, of contraband, Court was delayed and adjourned before a single juror hardship was addressed for the day. Stated plainly, Court was delayed solely because of Defendant Williams' and Defendant Adams' illegal acts of possession and distribution, respectively, of contraband inside the Fulton County Courthouse.

Accordingly, the State moves this Honorable Court to make a finding of fact that Court was delayed on January 18, 2023, because of the actions of Defendant Williams and Defendant Adams.
